Question 1

Study the following source material and then answer the questions which follow.

Source A

Adapted from comments made by Tran Van Tra, a senior Communist general, in 1982

During the Tet Offensive of 1968, we did not correctly evaluate the exact balance of forces between ourselves and the enemy. We did not fully realise that the enemy had considerable strength and that our own was limited. We had set ourselves objectives that were beyond our actual strength. As a result, we suffered large losses in equipment and manpower, which clearly weakened us. Not only were we unable to hold on to the gains we had made up to 1968, we also had to overcome

many problems in 1969 and 1970 so that the struggle could continue.

Source B

Adapted from the Communist Party's assessment of the Tet Offensive, published in March 1968

We have recorded great victories in all fields. We have inflicted on the enemy heavier losses than he has suffered in any previous period. We attacked all US and South Vietnamese centres of importance and exerted our control for a definite period. We liberated areas of the countryside containing about 1.5 million

5 inhabitants. However, we have not been able to annihilate many of the enemy's forces. We failed to create a military revolt in which South Vietnamese troops would rise and return to the people's side. All these have limited our successes.

'The USA's involvement in Vietnam escalated in the years 1965 to 1968 because President Johnson was personally committed to achieving victory.'

Explain why you agree or disagree with this view. (24 marks)

Question 3

O 5 Explain why the Watergate Affair contributed to the withdrawal of US forces from South Vietnam. (12 marks)

and

'In the years 1969 to 1973, President Nixon's policies showed that he was committed to protecting South Vietnam.'

Explain why you agree or disagree with this view. (24 marks)
