Question 1 Subjects and genres

0 1 Analyse the ways in which narrative is conveyed in **two** works of art, each by a different artist. (30 marks)

Question 2 Form and function

0 2 Examine the ways in which function is expressed in **two** non-religious buildings. (30 marks)

Question 3 Historical and social contexts

0 3 Examine **two** works of art, each by a different artist, which engage with a historical event. (30 marks)

Question 4 Patronage

Discuss the ways in which private patronage contributed to the appearance and meaning of **two** sculptures. (30 marks)

Question 5 Social and cultural status

Discuss the ways in which **two** works of art **and/or** architecture express the social status **and/or** cultural status of the artist. (30 marks)

Question 6 Gender, nationality and ethnicity

O 6 Compare and contrast two sculptures, each of which represents a single male figure.
