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### **CLEP English Composition Practice Question Answer Key**

1. The correct answer is E. Ask yourself who is selecting this dress? Alice is, not the store, so the sentence needs to show that.
2. The correct answer is E. The problem with this sentence is that it has too many "ands," which make it sound awkward. Eliminating the phrases with "and" makes a clearer sentence.
3. The correct answer is C. The phrase "they treated him royally at hotels" is unclear because the sentence never says who "they" are. Sentence C clarifies who treated David royally and preserves the rest of the meaning of the sentence.
4. The correct answer is B. The problem with this sentence is that the verb needs to be singular, namely, "was," not "were." The subject of this sentence is Wilbur. If the parenthetical phrase "not his brothers and sisters" is removed, we can clearly see that the sentence should say, "Wilbur was the executor."
5. The correct answer is D. The company is the subject of this sentence, so the proper pronoun is "it," not "they."
6. The correct answer is A. The sentence is correct as written.
7. The correct answer is C. Since Norman failed to clean not only the kitchen but also the living room, the phrase "was the cause of" is incorrect. The verb "was" refers to just one failure, but two failures are mentioned in the sentence. Also, the phrase "was the cause of" is awkward. Sentence C states the situation in a more direct, as well as correct, manner.
8. The correct answer is "C." As written, the sentence has a pronoun with no noun preceding it. We don't know who "they" are. Sentence C clarifies that.
9. The correct answer is B. The sentence as written raises a question as to who is running down the block. The bus is not. Jennifer is.
10. The correct answer is E. Since the sentence is in the past tense, "the beautiful music ended," the phrase about the bride and groom must also be in the past tense, "were still dancing together."
